

Samuel Beagles of Holbeach

LCC Wills 1800/31

In the name of God Amen I **Samuel Beagles** of Holbeach in the County of Lincoln Husbandsman being of sound mind and memory, do make this my last Will and testament in manner and form ??? That is to say imprimis I will that all my debts and funeral expenses be paid and discharged by my executrix herein after named. I give and bequeath unto my **son Samuel Beagles** the sum of one guinea to be paid one year after my decease. Also I give to my **son John Beagles** the house and garden situated in the Parish of Holbeach and for his own occupation, when he comes to the age of twenty one to him and his heirs forever but if he dies before he comes of age, then after the death of my wife the estate to go to my son **Samuel Beagles** and his heirs forever. Lastly I do make and give to my wife all of my goods and chattels and the house and garden while my son attains the age of twenty one years. To my beloved Wife I do and constitute Mary my said wife executrix of this my last Will and testament. In witness whereof I hereto set my hand and seal this Seventeenth day of June in the year of our Lord 1797..

Before me Robt Hood Surrogate

The Reverend Robert Hood b Whaplode 11 September 1736 died London 13 January 1811 was Curate of Guhirn Chapel and Latin and Greek master at Holbeach Grammar School. Evidence suggests that his sister Ann born Whaplode 21 January 1743 was the same Ann who was Samuel's first wife. She died on 27 August 1774.
